ERASMUS+ Barometer is accepting responses

The European Association of ERASMUS Coordinators (EAEC) has been contributing for years for the success of the ERASMUS mobility programmes. We believe that the dynamics for the new programme under ERASMUS+ are even better with the International ERASMUS included in the play. We designed a survey, called ERASMUS+ Barometer, for collecting useful information from the main actors in the HE Institutions managing the ERASMUS programme. A support letter from the European Commission can be found on the survey site. The information is collected on a yearly basis and analysed in an approach of monitoring indicators of progress and success. The results are officially announced every year during the ERASMUS Congress and Exhibition, known as ERACON Congress, as well as in a Session during EAIE annual conference. For the success of ERASMUS+ mobility actions it is very important to be able to have feedback from all stakeholders from the very beginning of the programme and during its development. Each year the survey may include additional questions, following the need analysis and the results of the discussions during the ERACON Congress each year.

The estimated time to complete the survey is 15-20 minutes but you will be able to save the data and come back to it later for completing it, before submitting. You will need to have the PIC number of your Institution ready.

the new Erasmus after 2020 – some highlights

After the approval of the Commission's proposal for a "new" Eramus after 2020, here are

some highlights of what is already known:

Increase the number of beneficiaries: Doubling the programme's budget will make it possible to support up to 12 million people between 2021-2027 - three times as many as in the current financing period.

Reach out to people from all social backgrounds: Through new formats and easier access for smaller and grassroots organisations.

Build stronger relations with the rest of the world: Mobility and cooperation with third countries will also be beested, through a combination of physical and virtual mobility.

Focus on promoting forward-looking study fields: The strengthened programme will give more attention to study fields such as renewable energy, climate change, environmental engineering, artificial intelligence or design.

Promote a European identity with a travel experience: The new DiscoverEU initiative will give young people opportunities to discover Europe's cultural heritage and diversity.

Applied Curricula in Technology for East Africa (ACTEA)

Artesis Plantijn University College Antwerp (Belgium) is coordinating the Erasmus+ KA2 Capacity Building project in the Field of Higher Education Applied Curricula in Technology for East Africa (ACTEA). In this project 6 universities in East Africa and 4 in

Europe will work together to develop and implement new courses in technology and engineering in Ethiopia, Uganda and Tanzania. As the focus of the project is on applied

sciences, the theoretical content of these courses will be supported by industry-grade lab infrastructure. This will be used for hands-on assignments, and remote and virtual labs are also foreseen for increased access to learning tools. To achieve the project goals, the National Research and Educational Networks of these countries will deliver support in IT and Internet accessibility. During the project teaching staff and students will receive dedicated training and education. To ensure relevance for the labor market, a strong cooperation with local business and government is set-up to assess the local needs for skills and competences and to disseminate the project's results to the wider economic environment. Because the subjects of the project, namely technology, engineering and skills training, are relevant to a lot of concerned people, the project is very open for cooperation and finding synergies with other initiatives. Total estimated budget is about €1 million for a period of 3 years.
