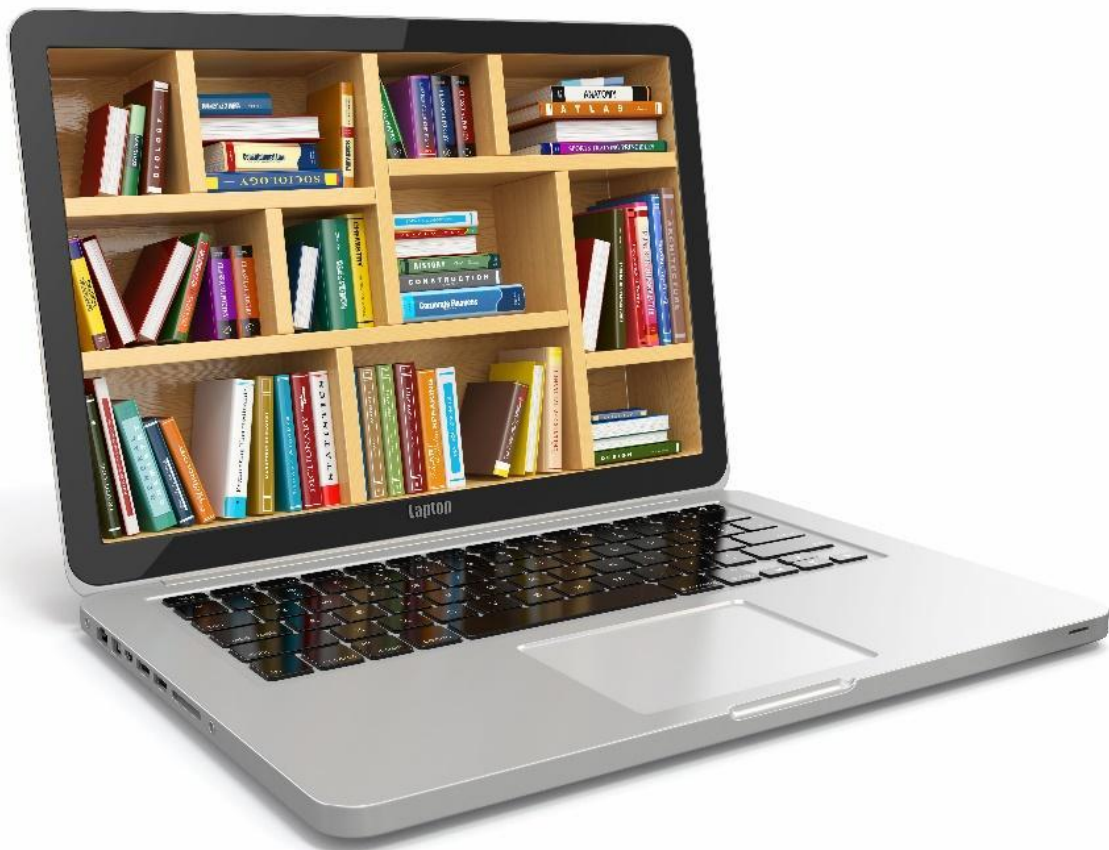

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WHAT IS ECOLHE?

The ECOLHE project is an action research project that aims to create the best conditions for an exchange of best practices, at European level, in:

- Teaching digital skills in HE (higher education)
- Training course for teachers and tutors for improving online teaching in HE in the logic of LLL (Lifelong Learning), inclusion and innovation recalled by High-Level Group on the Modernization HE
- Recognition and validation of teaching competences in HE for teachers' professional development
- Recommendation for Academic Bodies.



The project's main objective is to contribute to the improvement of schools' digitisation processes with the intent to intercept useful suggestion for policymakers, decision-makers, and Academic Bodies to build an EEHEA (European E-learning Higher Education Area) founded on the teacher's professionalization and EQAS (E-learning Quality Assurance Standard). As well as several research reports, the project will develop various training resources for education professionals. ECOLHE started in September 2020 and will last for 36 months.

The idea behind the project

A first concept of the ECOLHE project was born in 2017 and has been revised and improved since then. Well before the pandemic a clear awareness that the university system had to start dealing with a more intensive use of ICT in teaching and learning processes arose. By 2030, university students in the world should reach 414 million and, to meet their needs, the current rigidity of education tools and training systems will need to be overcome.

Today, the objectives of ECOLHE are more pertinent than ever: the project aims at highlighting experiences, practices and competencies of teachers, researchers, and university staff members active in the digital field, to foster the dissemination of best practices in training and skills development for online learning in higher education, according to the new experience of a hyper connected reality (Floridi, 2015).

It has been estimated that, after 2020, 90% of the jobs will require IT skills, it is therefore essential that education systems offer a learning paradigm that not only addresses current skills and knowledge deficits but helps people to become lifelong learners.

Today, it is hard to imagine future learning contexts, formal and not formal, without thinking about the use of innovative ICTs and new ways of online dimension significant involvement.

The principal objective of ECOLHE is to understand the way in which national policies have translated the European policies, and how universities have translated regulatory constraints in practice with the intent to intercept useful suggestion for policymakers, decision-makers and Academic Bodies to build a European E-learning Higher Education Area, founded on the teacher's professionalization and E-learning Quality Assurance Standard".

OUTPUTS

To achieve these goals, ECOLHE will implement different activities and outputs:

- analysis of organizational and teaching models, with reference to the role of HE in promoting innovation and
- teaching quality (IO1-IO5)
- the empowering of teachers' digital competences and strategies for online teaching (IO2-C1)
- the enhancing of digital tools and environments for lifelong learning, inclusion, diversity, and innovation (IO3)
- the continuous teachers' professional development (IO4-C1).

More in detail, the following are the outputs that will be produced by the project:

IO1 Report: "Digital Technologies in HE: from the European vision to the university governance"

This output explores how universities have transposed into organizational practices the provisions found in European documents, with a particular focus on the issues of exploitation of ICT for LLL, quality standards and teachers' professional development.

IO2 Training Pilot: "Online teaching in HE"

This output will be an online training course focused on updating teaching skills for teachers and tutors, to enable them to effectively integrate online and/or blended technologies in HE.

IO3 Training Pilot: “Engagement tools for HE online learning environment”

This output will identify methodologies and tools to foster the engagement of learners in online and/or blended learning activities to reduce digital dropout rates and enhance the effectiveness of teaching and learning processes.

IO4 Tool: “Symbiotic Learning Paradigm (SLP): Teacher Competences, Methods & Approaches in HE”

This output will foresee the development and testing of a tool for the self-assessment of HE professionals with a focus on digital competences.

IO5 Report: “Recommendation and guidelines for Academic Bodies”

This output aims at providing Academic Bodies with a useful framework and instruments to improve teaching quality, also by enhancing online and blended learning environments in HE.

PARTNERS

The **National University of Ireland, Cork (UCC)** (Irish: Coláistenah Ollscoile Corcaigh) is a constituent university of the National University of Ireland and located in Cork.

The **University of Patras, Greece** is a public academic institution located at Patras Greece, founded in 1964.

Laurea University of Applied Sciences operates in the Uusimaa region, Finland, at six different campuses. There are about 7,800 students, 600 staff members and 30,000 alumni in their community.

1ST MULTIPLIER EVENT - THE ICT IN HE: FROM THE EUROPEAN VISION TO THE UNIVERSITY

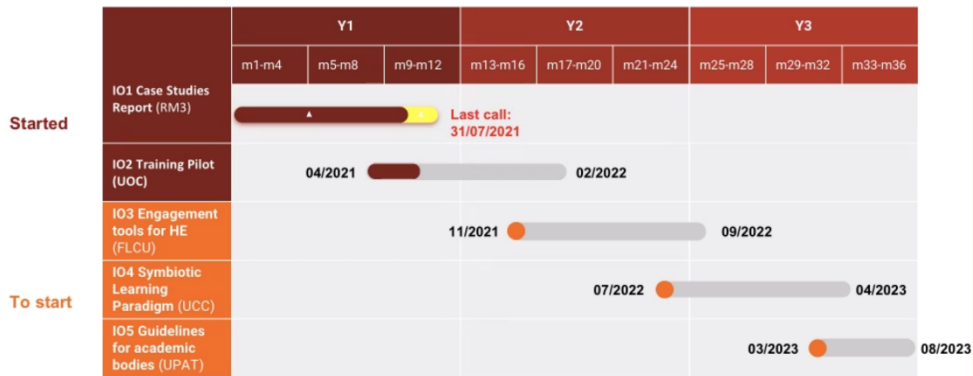
The first Multiplier event was held at M11 in Greece as tool sharing and co-evaluation for IO1 National research report: “Digital Technologies in HE: from the European vision to the university governance” (RM3) and IO2 Training pilot for online teaching in HE (UOC).

Partners set up its social network and searching throughout, grouped stakeholders and main country people to:

- think over the topic according to the question about teachers’ digital competences in the digital era
- share the results of the cases study analysis (IO1) with the academic community and with its main stakeholders; the partners will compare and comment the situation of each partner
- country both from the point of view of legislation and of universities micro policies, based on the research evidence (IO1/A2.1)
- share plan objectives and purposes in order to increase IO2
- put together new experiences about training teachers’ activities
- share criticism, trouble and suggestions
- have the best representative group which use search tools
- increase network of stakeholders, shareholders, educational institutions, digital publishers and developers
- co-evaluation activities realized and planned future ones.

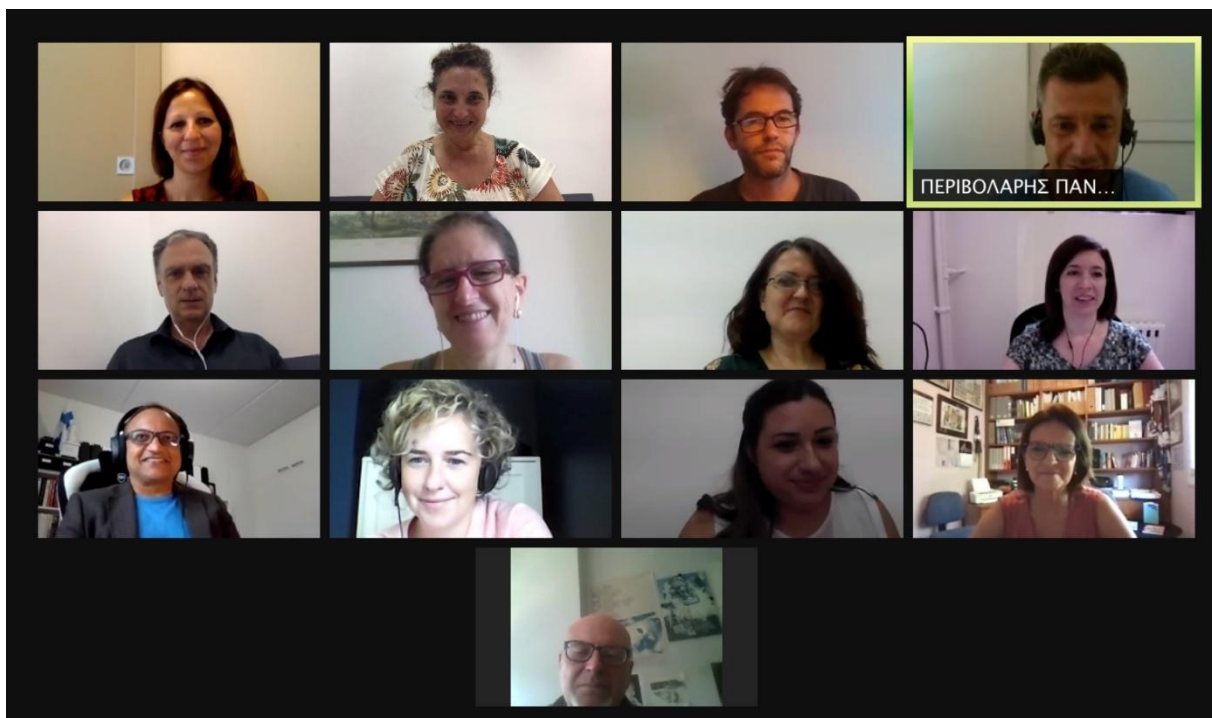

Laurea University of Applied Sciences (Finland) offered series of virtual 3-day staff training seminar and workshop to the partners of the ECOLHE-project. ECOLHE PROJECT AT THE SECOND INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OF THE JOURNAL SCUOLA DEMOCRATICA

On Friday 4 June 2021, the research group of the Erasmus + ECOLHE project conducted the panel Rethinking Higher Education at the time of Covid: challenges, new perspectives, critical issues hosted within the Second International Conference of the journal Scuola Democratica. The panel’s contributions reflected on the main issues of the ECOLHE project with the aim to explore the role of Universities and teaching-learning practices in contemporary society. In this regard the track developed an interdisciplinary discussion on the changes in universities already underway and accelerated by the covid epidemic, with respect to:

- new training model to respond to new knowledge and skills demands, in a context of a universal entitlement to lifelong learning
- the promotion of online quality relationships and e-learning standards
- the transformation of university in a complex organization, characterized by a more and more complex governance systems and the transformation of the internal and external management and power structure of roles
- the transformation of the figure of the university teacher and researcher accompanied by the need to rethink both the professional development system and that of insertion into the role
- the challenges caused by the digital revolution and the general demand for innovative learning methods and tools on the part of an audience of students that has changed significantly compared to the past
- the development of best practices in training and skills development for “online” learning in higher education (HE), according to the new experience of a hyperconnected reality (Floridi, 2014).
